The FireSafe Council Welcomes Chief John Justice

Chief Justice joins the board representing Santa Clara County Fire Department

County Fire's Deputy Chief John Justice is now filling the shoes of recently-retired Chief Dirk Mattern on the FireSafe Council.

John tells us he was raised in the small town of Moraga in Contra Costa County and attended Campolindo High School. If Moraga rings a bell, it might be because it's the home of Saint Mary's College which was well-known as the 49ers training grounds.

He got his first taste of fire service as a young volunteer firefighter with the Zayante Fire Protection District in tiny Felton in Santa Cruz County. He jumped in with 25 other community members who would help meet the needs of their community by responding to calls for assistance. At the time, he appreciated the relationship-building aspects of being a volunteer firefighter but had no idea it would lead to a career.

John earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business

Administration at Cal State Chico as well as a Hazardous Materials Management Certificate from UCSC Extension which led to work with a hazardous materials management company in the City of Santa Clara.

In 1990 he began his professional firefighting career when he joined the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District where he implemented a hazardous materials regulatory program for the City of Scotts Valley.

In 1996, John joined the Santa Clara County Fire Department as a Hazardous Materials Specialist in the Fire Prevention Bureau. Since then he has expanded his expertise to include terrorism response; chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear and explosives response; and natural disaster response and recovery.

As of December 2011, when he was named Deputy Chief of Support Services, he has been responsible for facilities, communication systems, supply

services and maintaining the Department's vehicle fleet.

John and his wife Debbie and their two daughters live in Santa Cruz. His 15-year-old aspires to a career which capitalizes on her singing and dancing talents. She's already performed the National Anthem at several high school sporting events.

John's 17-year-old daughter's autism challenges the family to help her prepare for a successful adulthood. She and John regularly pedal around Santa Cruz together on her tandem bike. This fits in well with John's passion for road biking and mountain biking. He says he is now retired from coaching girls' softball.
