Need More Defensible Space Around Your Home?

Are you really prepared for fire season?

The Santa Clara County FireSafe Council has received federal grants for Defensible Space Chipping Programs for eligible residents and a Special Needs Assistance Program for seniors and/or others with physical and financial limitations which prevent them from preparing for chipping.

For 2007, the eligible Communities at Risk from wildfires are East Foothills, Gilroy, Lexington Hills, Morgan Hill, parts of San Jose. San Martin. and adjacent fire prone Wildland Urban Interface areas. Funding for these programs is limited – please let us know if you are interested.
